We've awarded over £2.5 million in grant awards to community groups and charities across the county who are working day in and day out to help those most in need.

Across the last financial year, in addition to our Welcome Fund assisting relocated refugees and our Poverty Hurts Fund tackling financial hardship, we have worked closely with local authorities and charity partners to target poverty by providing and distributing Household Support Fund vouchers and wraparound services to our most vulnerable residents.

We have the privilege of working with a broad range of generous donors who, like us, care deeply about making a difference in Northamptonshire. We guide their donations to where aid is most needed and we are proud to present the impact of their generosity each year.

rantmaking Highlights

During the financial year 2022-23 we delivered Household Support Funds on behalf of North and West Northamptonshire Councils.



These funds are on behalf of the Department of Work and Pensions, and North and West Northamptonshire Councils, who are administering food vouchers and supporting food aid distribution through local food banks, agencies and charities, in response to the current cost of living crisis.

We have also funded local volunteer-led groups and small charities to provide additional wraparound support, including advice, counselling and family support.

ackling Doverty

Northamptonshire Community Foundation has worked alongside local authorities and charitable partners to help tackle poverty during the cost-of-living crisis and as part of the ongoing social and economic recovery from the pandemic.



In partnership with local newspapers, we launched a #PovertyHurts appeal and combined with our appeal work to tackle fuel poverty in winter and the cost-of-living crisis we raised £71826.45 thanks to the generosity of donors and the general public.

These funds were distributed as grants to local charities and volunteer led groups tackling increasing poverty through food parcels, purchasing stock for food banks, community fridges or larders, providing essential items such as toiletries, blankets, hot water bottles, clothing and providing essential advice services such as advice on energy consumption and payments, benefit eligibility checks or debt advice.

Our Friends of the Foundation Fund awarded over £39,000 to nine local groups working to end hunger.

The KHL Big Local Fund awarded **over** £15,000 to groups improving the wellbeing of residents in Kingswood & Hazel Leys, Corby.





Our "Warm This Winter Appeal" aims to combat fuel poverty, ensuring that older and vulnerable residents in our county are able to stay fed, warm and well throughout the winter.

This annual appeal which has been running since 2010, has raised an incredible **£247,471** thanks to local generosity and has helped to support **17,488 residents** to date. These funds have been instrumental in safeguarding some of the most vulnerable members of our local communities.

Winter is often the toughest season for the most vulnerable in our community. Many of them live alone, facing concerns about social isolation and the harsh cold of winter months.

Our Appeal plays a crucial role with many older and vulnerable residents having to make the difficult choice between heating their homes and affording food.

Volunteer-led community groups put on activities that highlighted how local community foundation-funded projects support the Global Goals in 'thinking global and acting local.'






Community Impact
